2024/25 MCCCE Educational Scholarship Instructions

The McCracken County Community Career Endowment (MCCCE) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization formulated to assist the African American Community of Paducah/McCracken County Kentucky to acquire an education, improve their marketable skills and secure employment in positions that safeguard their economic future. Primary funding is provided by an endowment administered by the Community Foundation of West Kentucky as established by the late Fred & (wife) Peggy Paxton.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (Current HIGH SCHOOL PaxtonScholars participants are not eligible to apply)

To be eligible, students must be:

- A citizen of the United States and of African American descent residing or have parent/guardian residing in Paducah/McCracken Co.

-Enrolled or planning to enroll as a full-time, or career seeking student at an accredited trade school, college, university, or community college during 2024 (prior to receiving assistance).

- Working on their first undergraduate degree – graduate students or 2nd degree students are not eligible

SELECTING RECIPIENTS

The MCCCE Scholarship Selection Committee will consist of representatives from the community and the MCCCE Board of Directors, who will review applications to determine the best overall applicants to receive scholarships. The highest-rated students will be selected as scholarship recipients.

Candidates whose applications are complete with required documentation will be notified of their status in May 2024. Scholarship recipients (or a representative) must attend the Annual Awards Reception to be held in (DATE TO BE SET)2024.

NOTICE TO PRIOR SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

MCCCE scholarship applicants (other than PaxtonScholars) shall not receive more than \$10,000 in direct scholarship benefits during their lifetime and shall not be eligible for the computer drawing after winning a computer. PaxtonScholars shall be eligible for additional MCCCE scholarship benefits after completion of their Fall college freshman year and shall not be eligible for the computer drawing.

REQUIRED SUBMISSIONS:

- > Completion of application, type or print legibly in black ink only.
- Attach a double spaced 250-500 word typed Personal Statement essay of your experiences community service activities (including high school years) and opportunities as outlined on page one.
- Professional Resume'
- > Attach an official transcript from your high school or college.

Late or incomplete submissions will not be considered. Application and required documents must be submitted to mc3cendowment@aol.com via e-mail by April 12, 2024. Scholarship recipients (or a representative) MUST attend the Scholarship Awards Reception in (DATE TO BE DETERMINED) 2024.

MCCCE anticipates awarding up to \$35,000 in total awards for full time African American students. All recipients must display a strong commitment to continuing their post-secondary education and pursuing a career that insures a sustainable income.
